Glick's Triangle to Reopen as Joseph's Training Center, Continues FCF's Neighborhood & Fatherhood Initiatives

A fixture of Freeport's Piety Hill neighborhood is being repurposed as a training center to spread the values of biblical fatherhood and hard work.

For decades, Glick's Triangle served the community not only as a grocery store but as a local landmark, but the passing of its owner and proprietor caused the family to consider other options for the property. Fortunately, this gave Faith Center Freeport an opportunity to purchase the Triangle, and, in partnership with Master Builder Ministries, convert it for neighborhood ministry. Faith Center Freeport volunteers assisted by exinmates have readied the building for a full renovation over several dedicated workdays. Funds are being raised for the next stage of work.

"We greatly appreciate the Glick family's kindness and willingness to work with us closely on this project," said Pastor Michael Sowell. "We know this will have a positive impact on the community because our plan is to use ministry models that have worked before."

The Glick's facility has been renamed Joseph's Training Center. Planned programs include addiction recovery, job training, fatherhood classes, mentoring and case management for ex-inmates

All services are free of charge to any person in need and are part of a process designed to deliver "a hand up, not a hand out."

Job training and job search assistance for former inmates will be strongly emphasized. "It's been said the best social program is a job," Sowell said. "Ex-inmates sometimes lack the skills to get a good, family-supporting job even if the employer is willing to look past their conviction. We'll mentor them so they can develop their Godgiven abilities, find good work and put the mistakes of the past behind them."

In addition to Joseph's Training

Center, the building will feature rental apartments which will provide a revenue stream for the ministry and serve as temporary housing for staff or visiting speakers.

The renovation is part of a wider initiative by FCF to change Freeport one life at a time and focus on the issue of fatherlessness in the community. Lack of a father in the home is the single most important factor in predicting poverty and other social problems.

"I began thinking about my Dad who was absent when I was growing up and about my son and how different his life has been because I was always there," said Pastor Sowell. "What if we give a father who would be absent the skills and focus to be the kind of father God wants in every family? That's the purpose of the Malachi Dads [inmate education program] and our overall fatherhood initiative."

Joseph's Pantry Update

What began with a four new shelf units in February is growing into a thriving ministry to the working poor. Pantry Director Bindy Lillge asked us to share these updates and requests with you:

- The Pantry is now a member of the Northern Illinois Food Bank and has placed its first NIFB food order.
- The support from church members has been great and the Pantry is serving lots of clients. For example, on 9/13 we served 54 families.
- As a result of joining NIFB, the Pantry will be open every Tuesday from 4 to 6pm.
- Our biggest food need is meat and we usually purchase it directly. For that reason, cash donations are especially helpful at this time.
- If you want to donate fruit or baked goods on days the Pantry is open, we would be very grateful.
- T-shirts with our awesome Joseph's Pantry logo (see below) are available for \$10-\$14 depending on size. All proceeds will go to help fund the Pantry.



Train Them Up!

"Train up a child in the way he should go, And when he is old he will not depart from it."--Proverbs 22:6

Few things are more crucial to the well-being and future success of a child than giving them a solid foundation in God's Word. From Jewel Heists to Living for Christ: Murph the Surf to speak at Master **Builder Banquet and FCF**

How does a jewel thief and murderer become an ordained minister, evangelist and crusader for prison reform? Only the power of Jesus Christ can explain such a change.

Jack "Murph the Surf" Murphy (so called because of his numerous surfing championships) was involved in what was then known as "The Jewel Heist of the Century" when he stole The Star of India and other jewels worth over \$2 million from the I.P. Morgan collection in the American Museum of Natural History in New York City. Murphy was eventually sentenced to life in prison in Florida for a murder, and it was as an inmate that he faced the cold reality that his life needed to change. He gave his life to Christ and has spent the years since ministering to prisoners, first on the inside and then (after being paroled) as a speaker for prison ministries.

Murphy will share his fascinating life history and the work of God in prisons as the guest of Master Builder Ministries at their 1st Annual Banquet on November 30th in Freeport. The banquet will raise funds for new inmate and ex-offender programs being launched in Stephenson County. Murph will also join us at our morning services on December 1.
